Gifu Cutlery Hall (Cutlery Market)

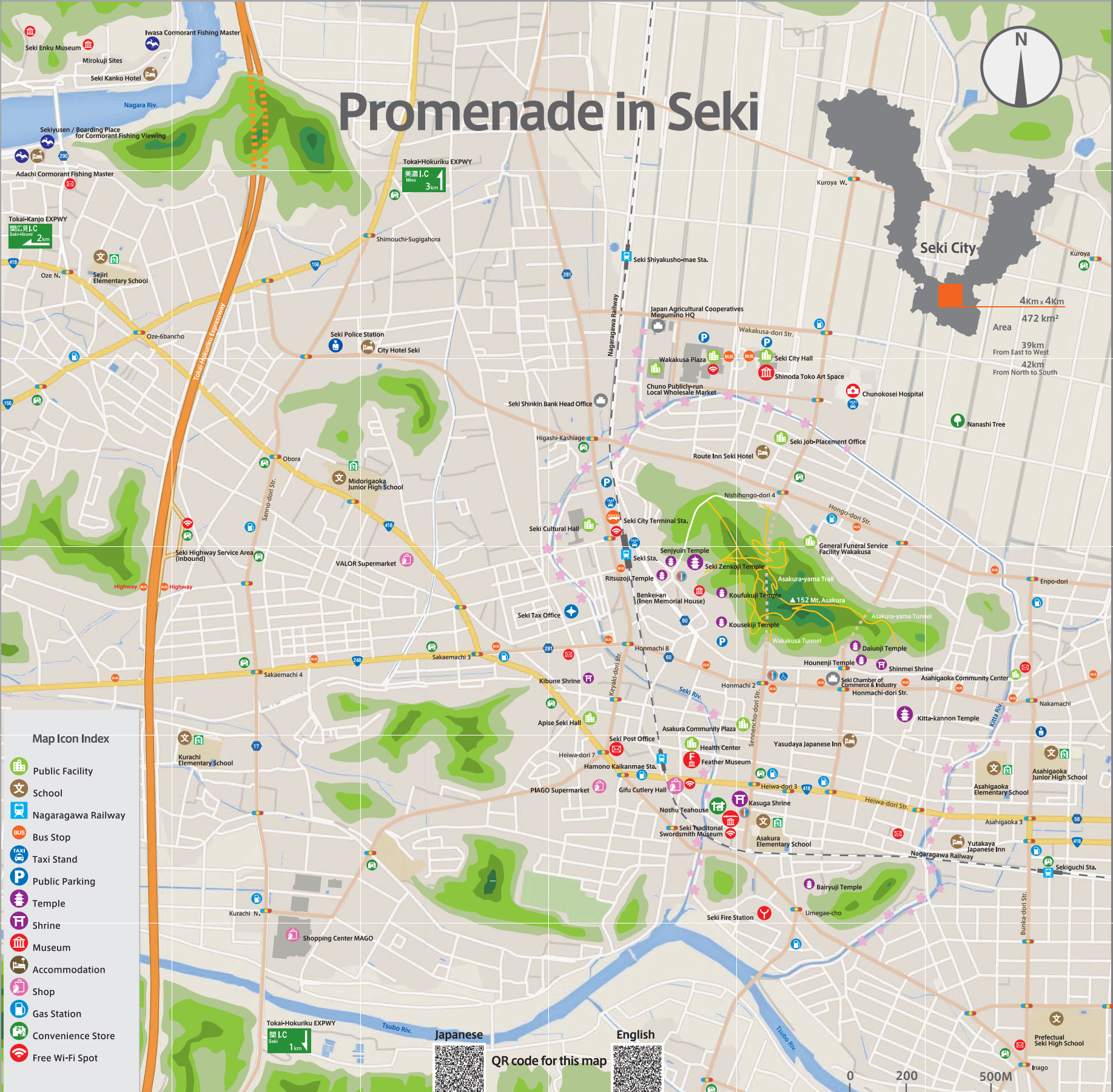
Gifu Cutlery Hall offers about 2,500 blade-related items such as kitchen knives, razors, scissors, and so on at a reasonable price.

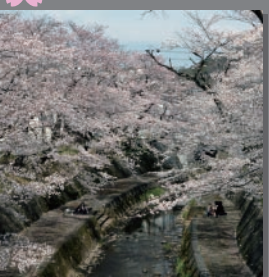
